Bob Inglis, Former Representative (R-SC)



Bob Inglis was elected to the U.S. Congress in 1992. He represented Greenville-Spartanburg, South Carolina, from 1993-1998, unsuccessfully challenged U.S. Senator Fritz Hollings in 1998, and then returned to the practice of commercial real estate law in S.C. In 2004, he was re-elected to Congress and served until losing re-election in the South Carolina Republican primary of 2010, largely because of his insistence that human activity was contributing to climate change.

Catrina Rorke is Director of Energy Policy and a Senior Fellow at the R Street Institute, where she promotes smart, small-government solutions to energy and climate challenges. While at AAF, she emphasized free-market policies and critiqued administration regulatory efforts.
